




Since April 2021 OHSH Projects has been exhibiting artists in Central London in an area that was once a hub for artistic creatives but has largely been decimated by rent increases and economic turmoil. Artists have been forced to relocate further and further to the outskirts of the city including south of the river and for our first exhibition in this area we feel it is important to spotlight the South London artistic community. Our **South Open** exhibition invited emerging artists to respond to an open call for artists who live, work or studied in South London. We are delighted to be exhibiting work by graduates of the Royal College of Art, Wimbledon College of Arts and Goldsmith's College, all South London institutions. The artists exhibited in the exhibition also have studios in Brixton, Peckham and Woolwich. Bringing these artists together reflects our endeavour to illuminate the breadth of talent across the artistic community south of the river.
